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Designed to bring students to the point where they can read Latin fluently, *DISCE*! combines the best of both the reading and grammar-translation approaches.

An original, unified story provides controlled introduction to vocabulary and grammar in context while also utilizing orderly and clear grammar explanations in every chapter. It thus combines the grammar-first approach and the reading-based approach. The guiding principle throughout is what is best for the student and for the particular concepts being studied at any given moment. *DISCE!* is for use in introductory Latin programs and appeals to students of varying abilities and instructors from a wide variety of institutions and curricula. It is suitable for both high school and college students.

Features:

Strongest Combination of Grammar & Reading Approaches

 DISCE! is the only introductory Latin text that combines the best features of both the traditional grammartranslation textbook and the reading approach, based upon a continuous narrative. Some grammar is best learned by induction while some is best learned through prior explanations of the grammar, and rooting the grammar in the continuous story of two families living in Rome ca. 9 A.D., allows the student to acquire new skills in a familiar setting.

Pragmatic Introduction to Grammar

DISCE! is focused on teaching students how to read Latin. Thus grammar and vocabulary are both introduced in the order of greatest frequency within commonly read authors. Each reading is preceded by just enough grammar to prepare the students to read the next Lectio, and these are followed by complete explanations. Finally, an Angulus Grammaticus section concludes each chapter, and provides more traditional and in-depth explanations and terminology for teachers and students who desire more.

Original, Engaging Storyline

 DISCE! is carefully structured to lead students to read authentic Latin within the time pressures imposed by various curricula. DISCE! is based upon a connected storyline set in Rome ca. 9 B.C. and following the lives of two families—one well to do and one working class. The story engages student interest and provides a framework within which to include the appropriate Roman cultural units.

Standards for Classical Learning

• The five standards for Classical learning (Communication, Culture, Connections, Comparisons, and Communities) are woven into every chapter of *DISCE!*, cultural material in *Mōrēs Rōmānī*, the influence of Latin in *Latīna Hodierna*, and the Roman geographical world in *Orbis Terrārum Romānus*.

Transition to Authentic Roman Authors

 Authentic Latin appears in every chapter, often worked into the story line and in various chapter sections. Such readings are adapted to the student's current reading level. Authentic readings include not only literary texts but also coins, inscriptions, and other documents. At the end of the book, every passage thus used appears unchanged and fully annotated to help the student make the leap to authorial Latin.
